Chaplaincy

- chap lain: Pronunciation[chap-lin] noun
- An ecclesiastic attached to the chapel of a royal court, college, etc., or to a military unit.
- A person who says the prayer, invocation, etc., for an organization or at an assembly.

Differences from CPO & CPE

- CPO (Clinical Pastoral Orientation)
 - One week
 - Continuing Education Credit (CEU) 0.3; Contact hours
 30 hours.
 - Creates an awareness of strengths and weaknesses
 - Help participants understand CPE
- CPE
 - Eleven weeks (400 hours of training)
 - Graduate credit (3 to 6)
 - Changes the person by focusing on personal growing edges and expanding strong areas.
 - It is a professional and accredited program
