



 - Master of Divinity in place of Post Graduate Diploma in Pastoral Ministry

COVID-19 & VVU

- Academic Schedule
 - Missed Semester I of 2020/21 year due to lockdown.
- Ongoing adjustments to regularize academic year
 - Running 3 semesters this year.
 - Blended teaching modes.
 - iSchool & VVU eLearning platform
 - Sandwich programme fully online since lockdown.
- December 2021 Graduation Face-to-face
 - Graduating 2,300 students

COVID-19 & VVU

- Enrollment & Recruitment
 - Inability to embark on face-to-face promotions.
 - Difficulty recruiting qualified lecturers during pandemic – job insecurity.
 - Succession plan in place
- Opportunities presented by covid-19
 - Fee collection rate increased up to 95% thru online exams.
 - Appreciation for online education in Ghana
 - Preparing to seek accreditation for 100% online school.

Infrastructure Expansion

 Searching for avenues to expand infrastructure to accommodate increasing demand for online education.



 Need for right-sizing became apparent in the wake of covid-19.




CHAPLAINCY

- Devotions and special prayer activities revived
 - Regular staff morning devotions
- Worship Sessions
 - Face-to-face worship resumed at 4 worship centres.
- Bible studies and revelation seminars.
- VVU Media Center
 - FM Station used for evangelism by staff/students.

CHAPLAINCY

- Blended Weeks of Spiritual Emphasis:
 - Streamed on Zoom, YouTube, HopeTV Ghana and VVU Radio
- Three (3) Evangelistic Groups
 - Divine Messengers Movement, ANNOUNCE, and THEMSA
 - Evangelize during vacations; assisted by VVU
- Baptisms from Evangelistic activities 406
 - Semester 1 241
 - Semester 2 165



- Theology & Mission Students Association (THEMSA)
 - Constructed 100 seater church building with two offices in Northern Region for a new church opened.
- Total cost estimated at USD 11,400.

- Training will take place at the Northern Region

STUDENT ACTIVITIES


- Student Leadership Training
 - Organized for all student leaders each semester.
- CAMFED Scholars (VVU Chapter)
 - Undertook Community Service Project Presbyterian pre-school.
 - Health talk, Sewing of buttons, patching of uniforms, songs, donations















VENTURES

- The University Venture Areas:
 - 1. Bakery
 - 2. Water Factory
 - 3. Farming (crop and poultry)

 Ventures contributed significant financial support during the lockdown.

FINANCE

- Self-Support: 131%
- Working Capital:
 - Percentage of Recommendation: 174.38%
 - Current Ratio: 1.49%
- Liquidity Statement:
 - Percentage Liquid Assets to Commitments: 49.06%
- Paid \$100,000 of VVU debt to WAD and has a standing order plan to clear remaining debt.

FINANCE

- GHS2.55m is invested to pay off Prudential
 Bank Limited loan on Dec 31, 2021.
- VVU **loan with Ghana Adventist Heritage Fund** stands at GHS5,055,000. VVU has a savings of GHS2, 344,974.34.
- VVU has established a GHS30,000 monthly standing order to pay off the debt of Advent
 Press that stands at GHS340,000.

FINANCE

- Capital Projects on the <u>Chapel</u> and the <u>School of</u>
 <u>Business</u> have been put **on hold** due to a review of the contractor's work output against funds given to the contractor.
- Waiting for the outcome of the Appointment of External Auditors. It is hoped that WAD Executives shall approve the request.
- Medical insurance is restored. Package cost is GHS500,000 a year for a benefit package of GHS9, 400,000.
